When Heaven Touches Earth

"What makes Christian faith distinct from other world religions?" asked a young Chinese student from Hong Kong. The question came to the GTN speaker during a presentation on Science and God to 200 young people gathered in Glasgow in October under the auspices of Scripture Union.

Distinctly Christian

Christianity has several distinctives but high among them is the belief that the child in Bethlehem's manger was God incarnate. No other religion claims to have encountered God in this way. It is possible only because God revealed himself cloaked in humanity.

Christmas Card Theology

It's both a complex and a simple idea. Many an artist has attempted to represent its wonder in a traditional Christmas card scene. The presence of one or more angels hovering over the stable might be artistic licence but for sure communicates to us that Bethlehem's manger is the primary example of where Heaven touches earth and revealed God to humanity.





Also on a typical Christmas card: the shepherds. This associates the Christian message, wrapped in God's love, with folk at the bottom of the social stratum. But the gospel is not a doctrine aimed only at the working class. Enter the kings from the East whose curious understanding of prophetic texts, combined with

astrology, led them too to the manger wherein lay God incarnate.

Revelation and Thought

The message was *directly* delivered to the shepherds in a Bethlehem field by the angel chorus. Mary and Joseph both received angelic revelations and were privy to the message *'Emmanuel: God with us'*. The wise men apparently concluded the circumstances for themselves, based on the evidence they had compiled. Both ways of identifying truth have their own validity: one a form of science; the other was revelation.

Also on the traditional Christmas card: the stable animals. They represent the poverty of the circumstances into which Christ was born. In an imaginative elaboration, the poet Thomas Hardy imagined even the animals knelt in worship.

The Service of Worship

And it is worship that unites parents and visitors, animals and humans, heaven and earth. We tend to think of worship as words, often with music, but in the New Testament the word some translate as worship is $\lambda \alpha \tau \rho \epsilon (\alpha)$. The word also means *'service* offered to God'. The worship of the wise men was not confined to their words and genuflecting. There was

sacrificial giving in the form of treasures offered to the Christ child and the effort needed to sustain the long and arduous journey. Worship is multi-faceted.

"O Worship the King", says the hymn. There are many ways to do so!

MSPs Impress with Principled Christian Stands

This GTN Online session, held at the end of October, was about politics but not about party divisions. It was clear from the input of our four guest MSPs that the Christian faith unites them more than politics is likely to divide.



One of GTN's high aims from its inception has been "the transformation of public understanding about issues related to

science and God". (Now the agenda has been widened to incorporate issues related to the reliability of the gospels and the problem of suffering.) However the transformation of public understanding remains key. But in what kind of society does our public live? Are its values diametrically opposed to the broad range of Christian values or does our Christian heritage still hold sway in the moral intuitions of the population? Living and working in the heat of the political arena, our Christian MSPs are well placed to offer insight.

Thoughtful and measured in their responses to every issue raised, all four politicians emphasised how much they value the prayers of the Christian public in supporting them in their roles. Brain, Consciousness and Near Death Experiences (NDEs)

GTN's last online session of the calendar year took the audience into the exploration of near death experiences—a widely reported and researched phenomenon that potentially contributes to the human consciousness debate. The issue: is consciousness a product of neuronal activity in the brain or might it be a separate entity? If there is no life after death it is impossible to see how consciousness could exist after the brain ceases to function. NDEs (if supported by the evidence) point to

Equipping Young People for the Science/God Debate

A common image of young people in the third decade of the 21st century is of a cohort of social media addicts with heads buried in the latest Smart Phone. It might apply to some but the young audience that met at the end of October in Glasgow for the Scripture Union event, known as Equip West, is a notable exception. Not only did the audience pay rapt attention to the talk given by the GTN representative on



science and God, but the quality of their questions illustrated young minds keenly engaged with big questions:

Can the theory of evolution and Genesis 1 and 2 fit together?

How does the Biblical account of 6 days of creation square with the origins timescale in astronomy?

Why does the Bible make no mention of dinosaurs?"

A memorable aspect of the evening was not only the quality of their questions; it was the concerned look on faces. Many of them expressed genuine concern and perplexity.

In the USA, the organisation BioLogos was set up in response to so many young people abandoning faith because they could not reconcile traditional interpretations of Genesis with the science taught in schools and universities. Its purpose is to help all Christians get to grips with the issues. Grasping the Nettle is also offering various forms of support. This comes chiefly in the offer of presentations to church and youth groups as well as the opportunity to experience *Exploring the God Question* in its full form or its abbreviated



version The God Question for Starters.

Sadly many churches in our land find it easier to ignore the dilemmas that sometimes cause conflict in young Christians' minds than to address them. As noted, Grasping the Nettle is willing to help but it requires partnership with Church leadership that sees the importance of anticipating the problem and putting measures in place to address it.
