Clearing the Fog

Just before the headline photograph was taken, the famous bridges across the forth were almost indecipherable through the enveloping morning mist but, little by little, as the temperature rose and the fog cleared, the full resplendent reality of this feat of Scottish engineering was laid bare. Similarly, GTN is about making the God question—for many shrouded in mystery—a clearer picture through the opportunity to explore it in some detail and in a systematic way.

In session 20/21, around 400 people joined the exploration, with many attending on several occasions. Afterwards we surveyed the group to measure responses to their experience of the events. respondents said they could foresee circumstances in which they could use information from the sessions when in conversation with others, whether of the same or different beliefs.



WOW! Wonders of the Brain





A New Global Series by Kharis Productions on Science and Religion Begins its Journey



Kharis Productions and Search for Truth Charitable Trust (SFTCT) have released a new series on Science and Religion geared to a global audience.

Although the themes are similar to *The God Question*, up to 50% of the filming—as well a around half of the contributors—came from the Far East.

But the global feel of this new series is in more than locations and people. Whereas *The God Question* series mainly contrasted how Christianity and Atheism answer the big questions of existence, the new films also incorporate the perspectives of Buddhism and the traditional Chinese religion Daoism.

Professor John Spence, Chair of SFTCT, said of the new series, "One aim is to open up the topic of science and religion principally to a Far Eastern audience and to demonstrate how four widely held world views can be compared and contrasted. Where does the finger of truth and reality seem

to point in relation to what is behind our existence? However it is expected that this content should be of interest worldwide". Science and the Ultimate Question has recently been released to Kharis Productions' international distributor 'Flame' who have secured the first sale to FTV Prima, a mainstream channel in the Czech Republic. A version, entitled **Science and God: The Search for**

Meaning and Truth, will soon be directly available to the public via *The God Question* Website. All programmes in both series are available with optional subtitles in Mandarin.

Meanwhile *The God Question* series continues to spread around the world, increasingly on Video On Demand channels. More recently re-named Science Vs. God? (the question mark is essential) the most recent network to acquire it is Dot TV, a new digital channel with worldwide broadcast aspirations.

Take a Fresh Look at Exploring the God Question



Since its official launch in June 2015, Grasping the Nettle has promoted the view that the question of God's existence is one that can be logically and clearly examined; we need not rely on vague hope, intuition or—worst of all—wishful thinking. In Romans 1:20 Paul emphasises that God himself is evident *'in the things which have been made'*.

The challenge of putting that thesis to the test was taken up by the producers of The God Question, a series which has now spread around the world, including on many mainstream TV channels. But rather than compile a one sided argument, each programme recognises that a movement called New Atheism came to prominence in the noughties, claiming that there is evidence aplenty the God does *not* exist and that science is in the business of supplying all the answers we need to the big questions.

Cue the battle for truth with world renowned advocates from both sides converging on the scientific evidence, available from our understanding of the cosmos, the development of life on earth and the wonders of human consciousness. "We believe one of the benefits of the series is that it does not

presuppose any real scientific literacy on the part of viewers," said co-producer Karen Rollins. "The programmes provide the audience with key science content in making an informed decision on the God question. Another valuable characteristic is that both the atheist and theist interpretations of the evidence are clearly set out in each of the three themes. The audience can adjudicate where the finger of truth points"



Since its launch to an audience of around 60 invited guests at Chatelherault Country Park on a snowy Saturday morning in March 2013, the series has travelled the world and has had the potential to reach a staggeringly large audience of 820 million people through multiple broadcast channels from CBC Canada to NRK Norway and from True Vision TV, in Thailand, to the South African Broadcasting Corporation (SABC) and more. The non broadcast version has gone to more than 30 countries.

Exploring the God Question is the 6 part version directly available to the public. It comes either on DVD or via web streaming and with a full colour study guide. Ideal for using with interested groups of any composition, it is highly recommended for use in churches and in homes. New Film Now Widely Available

Professor John Lennox is famous around the world for his defence of the Christian world view in the face of the popular atheist claim that belief in God is all nonsense. As an author, and notably as a debater of prominent atheists, the Oxford Professor of Mathematics and a Philosopher of Science has championed and argued the Christian cause around the world. Now the story behind his valiant stand against the tide of naturalism and atheism is told in this recently released movie, made initially for cinema.




Against the Tide is a travelogue, a science documentary, an odyssey into Biblical history and more. Narrated by American actor Kevin Sorbo (star of Hercules and Andromeda) who also joins John Lennox on the journey, the story begins in Northern Ireland before moving to Cambridge, Cardiff and Oxford – while incorporating visits to East Berlin, Hungary and Russia. Learn why and how John Lennox learned to speak fluent German and Russian and see a younger version of the man arguing the case for Christianity behind the Iron Curtain.

While part one of the film highlights why science points inexorably towards a creator, part two delves into history, travelling to iconic sites in Israel where, in dialogue with Sorbo, the Professor cogently makes the case for historical evidence pointing clearly to Jesus of Nazareth being the creator God incarnate. At the heart of the argument: the reliability of the gospel records and the evidence for the resurrection.
