

Crucifixion Unveiled

When during his coronation ceremony King Charles III was anointed with holy oil, the act was considered so sacred it was *hidden from public view*. When Jesus of Nazareth, mockingly named King of the Jews, took upon himself the atonement for the sins of the world, the dire ugliness of it took place in the *full glare of public view*.

The Barbarity of Crucifixion

Crucifixion was the grizzliest torture of all time. It would never be a victim's execution method of choice! One wonders if God's plan could not have been implemented at a more civilised time in



An artist's attempt to capture the horror and impact of crucifixion.


history! We know from Galatians that in God's eyes this was the right time.

Crucifixion was the form of punishment selected for the perpetrators of the most heinous crimes. A culture that enthusiastically feasted on the spectacle of death in circus rings actually banned crucifixion centuries later because it was considered too barbaric. Torture of the body was part of the design; public humiliation was exacerbated by naked-

ness. The early church didn't elevate Jesus' crucifixion in the way we find it presented prominently today in icons and symbols; it was too shameful and painful. Was it really necessary?

For the Sake of the Whole World

In his gospel, John tells us that the underlying reason for Jesus' excruciating execution was because 'God so loved the world'. Such self-sacrificing love is beyond human comprehension. The latter part of John 3:16 makes clear that the outcome was that whoever believes in Christ as saviour is granted eternal life. It was a brutal and colossal sacrifice but, if the resurrection is true, it purchased an offer available to the whole world.

The Resurrection Changed Everything

"If the story of Jesus had ended with his death it's unlikely that we'd ever have heard of him," says Sir John Polkinghorne in an interview recorded for a new programme in The God Question series with an anticipated release date of autumn 2025. It was belief in the truth of the resurrection that made a world of difference. But how strong is the evidence that it really happened? The forthcoming programme will investigate as objectively as possible.

Mission to the World

The world as a whole is clearly of great importance to God. On his departure from earth, Jesus instructed his disciples to take the gospel, not just to their immediate locality, but to the whole world.

In this edition of news from GTN we are delighted to share ways in which the resources which we encourage you to use are also spreading across the whole world. In partnership with you we can ensure that the area where you live is part of the whole.

The Empty Cross

The cross of Jesus is empty. The body was removed but there is more to the story. Scripture says Jesus was temporarily buried over a weekend. The occupant of the cross on which he was crucified is believed to be alive.

In 2025 Search for Truth Enterprises Ltd expects to release a new documentary programme: **The Jesus Question.** It investigates the central claims Christianity makes about Jesus. To whet the appetite here are some stimulating examples of comments from contributors.

A View From The Chair

Doubtless there's more to it than this but perhaps the scientific endeavour can best be summed up thus: the quest to explain.

Explain what? Certainly the physical world and the universe beyond on both micro and macro terms - but on occasions, it seems as if the answer is 'everything'. Science is the attempt to explain everything.

From my own perspective, I've always been somewhat uneasy about

that kind of approach. I remember recoiling in horror on one occasion when seeing a book entitled: **Every Answer to Every Question You Ever Had.** There's an arrogance about that which is laced with the kind of arrogance that usually leads in any number of wrong and often damaging directions.

When I was training to become a Church of Scotland minister, the final part of that process saw me learning under the Rev Fred Marshall. Of all the things he taught me (and there were many) the one that has stuck with me throughout my ministry is this one. He said to me, 'Martin, when you preach, seek not to explain the mysteries of God but to deepen them'.

There's a humbleness in that that I've tried never to lose sight of.

Now let's be clear in this. Of course the human mind strives for clarity. The American theologian Daniel Migliore was referencing the 11th Century Saint Anselm of Canterbury when he titled his book **Faith Seeking Understanding**. The longing for meaning is fundamental to what it is to be human and GTN is built on that very foundation. The problem comes when it is forgotten that there are limits to that.

Nowhere is that more true than when contemplating the events of Easter. Many of us know of the events of Holy Week and Easter and will have sought to understand what these things meant and continue to mean. But never let us stop marvelling. Let us never stop falling to our knees in wonder. And never let us stop realising that fulness of understanding will be ours only when the veil is eventually drawn back and we see face to face.

With that deep-set humility, let us take the joy of Easter into a world that now, as ever, needs to hear of a loving Saviour who gave his all for us.

The Easter Message—To The World

The God Question series is the centrepiece of the resources promoted by GTN. From the time of its launch until now its reach has been compared to the spread of the branches of a giant tree. On television it has achieved almost worldwide coverage through almost 50 broadcast television channels and through the growing number of video-on-demand (VOD) companies offering **The God Question** across the globe.

However, one of the very encouraging current areas of significant growth is the use of the series with **student populations internationally**. This involves the production of the resources in additional languages. Much of the momentum is being created through our cooperation with IFES (International Fellowship of Evangelical Students). Consequently:



the **Russian** version of **The God Question** has taken root

In the city of Balti, Pavel Polisciuc is preparing large scale events using **The God Question** at the start of the new term in August.

Additionally, the producers of **The God Question** are responding to a request to have the series in **Romanian** for use not only with young people in-country but also with Romanians in other parts of central Europe.



Taking The God Question Back to the Heart of Civilisation



Historically, Greece is the cradle of civilisation, learning and European culture. Despite their intellectual rigour and wisdom the Greeks of 2.5 thousand years ago professed belief in a raft of imaginary gods led by Zeus. In 399BC the philosopher Socrates was forced to drink poison as punishment for his scepticism about their existence. Just less

than 2000 years ago the apostle Paul came to this city to proclaim Christian truth about the God of the Bible, God of the universe and Jesus Christ his son.

Now both **The God Question** series and the cinematic film **Against the Tide** are being translated into **Greek** and becoming part of the process of today's ongoing evangelism. From the Greek Evangelical Alliance, Erastos Filos, who initiated the project, said "*Our young people desperately need well crafted opportunities to explore evidence for the truth of Christianity and these resources are ideal for that purpose."*

Reaching the Chinese Population

Meantime, Search for Truth Charitable Trust, responsible for Grasping the Nettle, continues to promote **Science and God: the Search for Meaning and Truth** especially to the ethnic

Chinese population. In substantial numbers, many are students in Europe and elsewhere. Sometimes known as our 'Global' series, the programmes incorporate content and contributors from the orient as well as from the west. The programmes and their study guide are available in both current versions of




Mandarin: Traditional and Simplified—and also in English.




Onwards to Latin America

After its production in English, The God Question was dubbed in **Spanish**, creating the series **La Cuestión de Dios**. The dubbing took place with professional actors in the studios of Fox Films, Madrid.

Now the Spanish series is being promoted across many of the

countries of Latin America, especially within the student population. Regional IFES Director for the sub-continent, native Chilian, Carmen Castillo, said "*La Cuestión de Dios is a wonderful resource for students because it addresses issues they find stimulating and raises many questions that take us to the heart of Christianity*".




Encountering the Creator God: Spreading Across Europe

At one end of the spectrum of viewers of **The God Question** series are those interested to investigate whether science and belief in God are compatible.

At the other end of the spectrum are others who wish to explore how modern academic learning, including science, might inform our interpretation of Scripture.

Responding to the interest of those in the latter category, Search for Truth Enterprises has published the eight-part Bible study series **Encountering the Creator God.** Although a word based document, each study offers a hyper-link to a relevant extract of **The God Question** or **Against the Tide.**

The subject of creation is central in Scripture: it begins with the creation of the earth (after a brief reference to the heavens), subsequently emphasises the need for fallen humanity to become a new creation and ends with the creation of new heavens and a new earth. The studies provided in **Encountering the Creator God** take users to eight 'landing spots' from Genesis to Revelation, each concerned with an aspect of creation.

Eva Petrzilkova's introduction to Encountering the Creator God took place at a conference

in North Macedonia, Greece where Search for Truth resources were highlighted. Prague-based Eva has Europe-wide responsibility for promoting Scripture engagement for her organisation. Commenting, she said *"I'm excited about this new resource. I know of nothing like it and it addresses many of the big questions that Christians have. I am sharing this with IFES colleagues across the continent".*

are available here and in English! Not only so, GTN Liaison Officer George Lind is very willing to help organise, participate in or lead




sessions on Exploring the God Question. Note too that the series in its 'For Starters form offers each of the themes in 10 bite-sized extracts
