Confident Christianity Conference

And the song goes on to say 'We thought they'd never end!' But they did!

Pre-lockdown, the scene is very familiar - as well as encouraging. Almost 200 people gather for a Saturday conference at Maxwell Mearns Parish Church in Newton Mearns for a 'Confident Christianity' Conference held prior to the onset in the UK of the current world health crisis.

Organisers SOLAS had invited Grasping the Nettle to contribute two of the six plenary sessions. The topic? Science and God Under the Microscope.

Both were delivered by GTN's Director of Programmes.

As the whole country suddenly went into lockdown, GTN - as with every other organisation trying to serve the public interest - needed to find ways of continuing to do so that were creative, safe and effective.

'Necessity often fuels creativity,' said GTN chairman, the Very Rev Dr Angus Morrison 'and we are delighted by how we have been able to rise to the current challenge'.

VIRTUALLY AND REALLY EXPLORING THE GOD QUESTION

As lockdown tightened its stranglehold on the movement of people, many GTN plans had to be shelved or changed. GTN Liaison Officer Rev George Lind suddenly had cancellation lines through a busy schedule of presentations and meetings. But they were only pencil lines! In 2 Timothy 2:9 St Paul in his own form of imprisonment wrote that 'God's word is not chained'. And neither is GTN.

Quickly, other ways were found - not only to continue Grasping the Nettle but to take advantage of the expansiveness of online opportunities. Exploring the God Question as a 'virtual community' suddenly took hold of the imagination. In six sessions, held on Tuesdays and Thursdays over a two week period during April and May, the Scottish core participants were joined by others from Spain, Norway and France and even the USA. Zoom technology,

facilitated by Sanctus Media, not only enabled shared viewing of The God Question programmes but also offered chat rooms in which smaller numbers could discuss the issues arising and reflect on the core questions in the study guide, made available to all participants.

Assisted by GTN's Liaison Officer, Rev George Lind, the sessions were led by the then Moderator Designate of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, Rev Dr Martin Fair. 'These sessions which I was privileged to lead brought together a community of people who otherwise would never have met each other' he said. 'This was a truly unique and fascinating international forum built around topics that are fundamentally important to us all. Once again, I was impressed by how the programmes can bring together people of different backgrounds and opinions to explore big questions of science and faith.'

ON THE FRONT LINE





A PRICKLY ISSUE IN THE SCIENCE AND GOD DEBATE

The late Ravi Zacharias, one of the greatest Christian apologists of our times, took as his mantra 'helping believers think and thinkers believe.' And that is close to the GTN position too. But within the community of believers there are ongoing discussions about God and science that can sometimes become a form of nettle that needs to be grasped.



Take the issue of Intelligent Design Theory (IDT).

What does it stand for? Does the term fairly encompass the standpoint of all believers? If so, why do some Christians reject it? That whole important matter is being debated in the GTN website Forum between IDT advocate Dr Antony Latham and Dr Alan Fraser who embraces a more orthodox scientific position (Evolutionary Creation).

Providing his view of the debate, Professor Chris Packard, a member of the Board of Search for Truth Charitable Trust (the body which sponsors GTN and owns The God Question series) wrote, "Aware of the caution with which this (debate) was approached, I believe the exchange, which was a robust but respectful dialogue, gave an excellent insight into the topic... Antony and Alan should be congratulated on grappling with this issue which is important in a number of Christian settings." You can follow the debate which is nearing its conclusion - here.
